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Prize money for winning masters golf

The Masters 2025 is all wrapped up, and what a nail-biter it was! Rory McIlroy finally got his hands on that elusive green jacket by takin' down Justin Rose in a playoff after makin' bogey on the last hole. Players who didn't quite make the cut still went home with somethin', gettin' \$25,000 from the Masters for participatin'. Here's how the prize money shook out for every player: ... The top 10 finishers shared a total of over \$14 million in prize money. In contrast, the first Masters tournament held in 1934 paid out just \$1,500 to the winner, Horton Smith. It wasn't until 1946 that the payout increased to \$2,500, and it took another 30 years for the winner's share to exceed \$100,000. Tiger Woods holds the record for the most money won at the Masters, with a total of over \$9 million. The prize money has continued to grow over the years, with significant increases in the 1990s and 2000s. The current payout structure offers the winner a minimum of \$2.27 million, with increasing amounts for each position down to 10th place. Caddies also benefit from their players' success, receiving 10% of the winnings if they win the tournament or 7% for a top-10 finish. The Zurich Classic in Salzburg featured 80 two-man teams before the cut on Friday night, which reduced the field to 36 pairings for the weekend. The first and third rounds used the fourballs format, where each player used their own ball, and the best score on each hole contributed to the team total. In contrast, the second and final rounds employed the foursomes format, with each pair using one ball and playing alternate shots. The winners secured a spot at the PGA Championship, while those who made the cut were eligible for prize money and FedExCup points. The top pairs received 400 points and a record \$1,329,400 each. Rory McIlroy, struggling with a cold, is ready to tackle TPC Louisiana again after being confined to bed on Monday morning due to his illness. "I need to start hitting some balls again and getting back into it," he stated. When asked about defending his title alongside Shane Lowry, McIlroy expressed his excitement: "It's been an amazing few days but I'm excited and I'm happy to be here with my man." In a related news, the Masters prize money purse has reached a record high of \$21 million, with the winner's share increasing by \$600,000. The full breakdown of the 2025 Masters prize money is available for reference. The Masters golf tournament has undergone significant changes in prize money over the years. In its inception in 1934, the purse was \$5,000 with the winner receiving \$1,500 (approximately \$36,000 today). The Masters' prize money increased gradually through the 1950s and '60s. Notably, Tiger Woods became the first player to win a seven-figure check after his 2001 victory. Comparing this to other major golf tournaments, the Masters has consistently offered more substantial prizes than its counterparts. For example, the US Open and PGA Championship in 1934 had significantly lower purses. The purse for The Open was £100 (approximately \$1,500 today).
